| Getting dressed for<br>school         | Our school uniform consists of a white<br>polo shirt and royal blue sweatshirt.<br>Pupils can wear a shirt and our school tie.<br>In P7 our pupils wear a black sweatshirt<br>and midway through the year our P7<br>pupils get a leavers hoodie. Pupils can also<br>wear leggings, jogging trousers and<br>hoodies as part of their school uniform.<br>On PE days children come dressed in their<br>PE kit with their school jumpers on.<br>We have a community cupboard at the<br>front door. Families can take free new and<br>nearly new school uniforms, jackets, shoes<br>and seasonal clothing e.g. Halloween<br>costumes, Christmas jumpers.<br>We do not ask for donations for Dress<br>Down Days. | Referrals can also be made to the West<br>Lothian clothing bank by any member<br>of staff at any time.<br>We support families to purchase the<br>leavers hoodies for P7.<br>During the winter we buy hats, scarves<br>and gloves to give to children to allow<br>all children to access outdoor play.<br>All staff can make referrals to FORT<br>(Fast Online Referral Tracking). |
| Travelling to and from School         | Our school serves the catchment areas of<br>Pumpherston and Uphall Station. Most of<br>our children can walk to school. Some of<br>our pupils arrive by taxi or car.<br>We have a bike and scooter parking area<br>at the front of the school for pupils to<br>access.   | School staff can support parents when<br>making applications for school<br>transport.<br>Bikeability sessions are completed with<br>our primary 5 and Primary 6 children to<br>develop practical skills and understand<br>how to cycle safely on today's roads.   |
| Postive<br>Relationships in<br>school | We teach the importance of our<br>relationships and challenging<br>discrimination through our Health and<br>Wellbeing curriculum. All pupils identify<br>trusted adults in school and track their<br>wellbeing using the wellbeing indicators.<br>Our school is accredited with the Silver<br>Rights Respecting school award.  | We are a nurturing school and we<br>provide Nurture support for children<br>who need it.<br>A multi-agency approach is used to<br>support learners.   |
| Eating at school                      | Through our health and wellbeing<br>curriculum we learn about eating healthy<br>foods.<br>We have a selection of healthy snacks for<br>pupils to access if they don't have a snack<br>or have forgetten one.<br>We have a free fruit Friday trolley, which is<br>taken to each class prior to break.   | We promote Free School Meals and<br>share information for all parents about<br>it at various times throughout the year.<br>Cashless catering means that there is<br>less stigma attached.   |

| Learning at School | Breakfast club is available for all pupils<br>(free) between 8.10-8.30am.<br>We have a community cupboard (food<br>bank) at the front door where families can<br>access free food.<br>Classrooms have essential supplies such as<br>pencils/calculators etc. for pupils to use<br>and borrow.                            | Children are supported with learning<br>resources if they need it including<br>digital equipment.   |

|                    | Pupils at PUSCPS do not pay for any core<br>learning activity.   |   |
| Home Learning      | Home learning is available on SEESAW for<br>P1-3 and on TEAMS for P4-7.<br>Home Learning is set on termly home<br>learning grids to allow all families to<br>engage in home learning when it suits<br>their family life. Tasks that are set every<br>week such as spelling, reading and<br>numeracy will be highlighted. | Staff will provide support with paper<br>copies of tasks if required and<br>resources.  |
|                    | We ask for a donation rather than a set<br>amount and we do not track who hands in<br>money.   | All children take part in events<br>regardless of whether they have made<br>a donation.   |
| School Excursions  | Our Parent Partners contribute to the cost<br>of school trips. We give consideration to<br>all trips and where possible do not charge<br>pupils to attend these.<br>We plan residential trips in advance and<br>have saving options to spread the cost.  | We support families with the cost of<br>trips and use our funding to ensure all<br>children have the same experiences.                          |
| Afterschool clubs  | Afterschool clubs are provided free of<br>charge or at a subsidised cost to all pupils<br>where possible.  | Pupils in receipt of Pupil Equity Funding<br>are offered additional free afterschool<br>clubs   |
| P7 Leavers' Event  | Our Parent Partners and Pumpherston<br>Community Council pay for the P7 Leavers'<br>Event to ensure all children can attend.   | Primary 7 children are involved in fund<br>raising for the leavers party by having<br>their own stall at Parent Partners fund<br>raising events |
| Period Poverty     | Sanitary products and changes of<br>underwear are available for pupils in the<br>upper toilets.<br>Sanitary products are also available in the<br>community cupboard for families to<br>access.  | P7 girls are given a Hey Girls Starter<br>Packs.  |
